Biographers Andrew Lycett and Henry Chanceller discuss Ian Fleming the man, while Andrew Lownie traces the legacy of John Buchan — creator of Richard Hannay. Kate Westbrook, author of the *Money Penny Diaries*, discusses "Britain's Last Line of Defence." Lectures by Nigel West, professor David Cannadine and Corelli Barnett explore the history of the Secret Intelligence Service, Cold War politics and more.

Extension: Cambridge Spies

Dig deeper into the Cold War espionage in the center of deception and betrayal — Cambridge. In the 1930s, Cambridge became a hotbed of treachery as the Soviet Union recruited a number of young men at Cambridge University as spies. The students penetrated the British establishment at the highest levels and became known by the KGB as the “magnificent five.”

Intelligence expert Nigel West reveals the significance of the Cambridge Five, paying particular attention to Kim Philby — a name synonymous with betrayal — and the NKVD “sleeper” agents dubbed the Great Illegals. Visit the Intelligence Corps Museum at Chicksands and locations connected to the Secret Intelligence Service and Special Operations Executive. On walking excursions through the colleges of the Cambridge Five, learn how a group of undergraduates became a famous British spy ring that passed information to the Soviets during and after World War II.

Highlights

- Trace the path of the Cambridge Five spies on a Cambridge College walk through Trinity, St John’s and King’s College and Chapel.
- Nigel West discusses the Cold War in movies before a screening of a John le Carré film.
- Exclusive access to the archive collection of the Intelligence Corps Museum at Chicksands.
